

Congratulations to John Carroll High School's Advanced Placement Scholars!

Five students at John Carroll High School have earned Advanced Placement Scholar Awards in recognition of their exceptional achievement on AP Exams.

The College Board's Advanced Placement (AP) program provides motivated and academically prepared students with the opportunity to take rigorous college-level courses while still in high school, and to earn college credit, advanced placement, or both for successful performance on the AP Exams. Only 18 percent of the nearly 1.7 million students worldwide who took AP Exams performed at a sufficiently high level to earn an AP Scholar Award, and John Carroll High School is proud to have 5 of those students.

The College Board recognizes several levels of achievement based on students' performance on AP Exams. Two John Carroll students qualified for the AP Scholar with Honor Award by earning an average grade of at least 3.25 on all AP Exams taken, and grades of 3 or higher on four or more of these exams. These 2010 John Carroll High School graduates are James Carr (attending New York University) and Victoria Delaporte (attending University of Florida).

Three John Carroll students qualified for the AP Scholar Award by completing three or more AP Exams with grades of 3 or higher. The AP Scholars are Dean Helseth (attending Florida State University), John Rodgers (attending University of Notre Dame), and Taylor Tench (John Carroll High School Senior).

A special note of congratulations to James Carr for earning the highest score available (5) on his Environmental Science, and U.S History exams and to Taylor Tench for earning the highest score available on the U.S. History exam as well.

Through more than 30 different college-level courses and exams, AP provides willing and academically prepared students with the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced placement and stand out in the college admission process. Each exam is developed by a committee of college and university faculty and AP teachers, ensuring that AP exams are aligned with the same high standards expected by college faculty at some of the nation's leading liberal arts and research institutions. More than 3,800 colleges and universities annually receive AP scores. Most four-year colleges in the United States provide credit and/or advanced placement for qualifying exam scores.
