School Profile

School Community and Demographics:

John Carroll High School is a co-ed Catholic high school serving approximately 415 students in grades 9-12. The school is in Ft. Pierce, FL, and serves students from Indian River, St. Lucie, Martin, and Okeechobee counties. JCHS is the only Catholic high school within an hour's radius of Ft. Pierce. The school originally opened as part of St. Anastasia Catholic School and opened under John Carroll High School in 1965 as a Diocesan regional high school. The Florida Catholic Conference accredits the school in accordance with Cognia and holds membership in the National Catholic Education Association. Since John Carroll began accepting the Florida Tax Credit Scholarship in 2012, our student body is now more representative and reflective of our community. We embrace our growing diversity and consider our unique cultural pluralism one of our greatest strengths. The student body is approximately 71% Caucasian, 20% Hispanic, 12% African-American, 2% Asian, and 1% other ethnic backgrounds. The school accepts the Florida Family Empowerment and Family Empowerment - Unique Abilities scholarships through the state of Florida. Additionally, nearly 70% of our student body identifies as Catholic for the 2025-2026 school year.

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Schedule & Curriculum

The school's academic program reflects a modified block schedule unique to John Carroll High School. Students attend their classes three times each week for 72-minute periods. There are two "flex sessions" throughout the week where students have an opportunity for extra academic support and fellowship through non-academic community events. John Carroll maintains high academic standards and expectations for all students; therefore, the school offers Advanced Placement, dual enrollment, honors, and college preparatory classes. A student must meet strict guidelines and prerequisites to participate in an AP class; the school does this to ensure a high level of academic rigor in these classes and that all students are prepared to meet the demands of an AP course. Dual enrollment opportunities are offered on our campus through a partnership with Indian River State College.
